# Learning outcomes

On completion of the course, the student shall be able to:

- Demonstrate knowledge and understanding of the artistic research field
- Demonstrate expertise and skills to discuss, structure and problematise regarding an artistic research project.
- Demonstrate judgement and approach for analytical knowledge in relation to their own artistic project.

#### Course content

The course is intended to be a preparatory course for research and is carried out in the form of a microlab.

During the course, the students get the opportunity to deepen their knowledge of different aspects of the artistic research field.

Professional artists and researchers present projects and aspects relating to artistic research that the students discuss, individually and collectively, and reflect on.

The course concludes with the students writing individual proposals for artistic research projects.

## Course design

The course consists of lectures, seminars and supervision of the students' individual projects. The teaching sessions are compulsory.

#### Assessment

The assessment consists of active participation in seminars and presentation of the student's individual project (7.5 credits).

The examiner, in consultation with Disability Support Services, may deviate from the regular form of examination in order to provide a permanently disabled student with a form of examination equivalent to that of a student without a disability.

Degree of Bachelor of Fine Arts (180 credits) or equivalent, and approved portfolio.
